WHAT IS #REALCOLLEGE?

The #RealCollege survey is the nation's largest, longest-running annual assessment of basic needs insecurity among college students. In the absence of any federal data on the subject, the Hope Center for College, Community, and Justice created the survey in 2015 to evaluate access to affordable food and housing among college students.

WHO ARE WE?

The Hope Center for College, Community, and Justice is redefining what it means to be a student-ready college, with a national movement centering #RealCollege students' basic needs. Food, affordable housing, transportation, childcare, and mental health are central conditions for learning. Without those needs met, far too many students leave college in debt and without degrees.We are conducting action research and fighting for the resources and supports to help #RealCollege students succeed.

Students are humans first.

In 2019, nearly 167,000 students from 171 two-year institutions and 56 four-year institutions responded to the #RealCollege survey. The results indicate:



39% of respondents were food insecure in the prior 30 days



46% of respondents were housing insecure in the previous year



17% of respondents were homeless in the previous year 1

The #RealCollege survey has been cited in many pieces of state legislation and of federal legislation over the past five years, inspiring efforts to improve support for student's basic needs around the country.


Senator Warren and Representative Lawson Introduce the College Student Hunger Act of 2019 to Address Hunger on College Campuses

More than 30% of college students might face food insecurity, and almost 2 million at-risk students did not receive SNAP benefits in 2016, even though they were eligible; Legislation would ensure support to food-insecure students and remove barriers to low-income college students accessing SNAP benefits by expanding the eligibility criteria
