Prior to joining Hope, Lauren consulted for various international organizations and was the Director of Communications at Media Impact Funders and The GroundTruth Project's inaugural international correspondent. Based in the Middle East for almost a decade, she was one of the first women columnists at Foreign Policy magazine and co-founded Foreign Policy Interrupted, an initiative dedicated to amplifying women-identifying voices in international affairs. She's also the co-founder of SchoolCycle, a United Nations Foundation campaign in Malawi and Guatemala that provides bicycles for adolescent girls to get to school.

"My life's work is to help create a world in which opportunity is just as universal as talent," Lauren said. "We need an intersectional, systems approach to make that happen, and I'm ecstatic and honored to join a visionary team where hope actually has a strategy."

Lauren holds an MS from Northwestern University's Medill School of Journalism and a BS from New York University. Originally from Philadelphia, she has reported from over twenty countries but always misses Wawa coffee.
